## FMD: Victory for farmers

### Best FSA member

Free State Agriculture (FSA) welcomes the latest order of the Pretoria High Court, which marks a decisive turning point in the ongoing fight to protect South Africa's livestock industry against foot-and-mouth disease (FMD).

Following months of legal action driven by FSA and its partners, the Court has on 25 May 2026 confirmed that livestock owners may, under clearly defined conditions, procure and administer lawfully imported or manufactured FMD vaccines to their animals.

The order further prohibits undue interference by the state in lawful commercial relationships within the vaccine supply chain, reinforcing the need for a functional and accessible vaccine market.

While the order provides immediate interim relief, the matter will proceed to final determination, with further legal steps to be instituted within 20 days.

FSA will continue to engage the legal process to ensure that the final regulatory framework supports the agricultural sector, protects livelihoods, and strengthens national biosecurity.

# Energy challenges and opportunities

Free State Agriculture remains actively engaged in discussions with ESKOM regarding the impact of electricity costs on farmers.

Following our previous quarterly meeting, ESKOM Central hosted an online information session to explain the new tariff structures and bill components. Although attendance was limited, the session provided valuable insight – particularly that the fixed cost component makes up a larger proportion of the bill.

Despite these challenges, farmers are encouraged to consider alternative energy solutions where feasible. Financial support is available through the Landbank's Agro-Energy Fund, which can cover up to 50% of the cost of alternative energy installations in the form of a grant.



## Subsidized ear tags

In May, FS launched a subsidised ear tagging initiative to place unique identification numbers in the ears of livestock. This supports the roll-out of foot-and-mouth disease (FMD) vaccine and encourages farmers to participate in the voluntary vaccination scheme, while also helping to put in place the necessary regulatory systems for the purchase and administration of vaccine.




Farmers who are not yet registered on <https://FS.AIMS.farm> can order ear tags at R6 per set (standard ITT tags) or RFID buttons at R8 (first 200 per FS member). After that, standard prices apply. Stock is available immediately from FS, with the option for additional laser printing for a one-off fee.

Registration on the system is required, and all ear tags are uploaded to the AIMS traceability system in the purchaser's name. When animals are moved, relevant information is automatically shared with RMIS, which generates documents such as Section 6 and 8 forms and animal health declarations. These integrated systems contribute to a national traceability system that supports international trade according to WOH standards and strengthens local biosecurity.

# Vehicle Registration & License fees

Farmers should take note of new vehicle registration and license fees, as announced in the Government Gazette of 29 May 2026.

Most categories remain unchanged at 0% but there are certain categories where a 4% increase applies.

## Maize theft

Maize theft remains a major risk that can adversely affect farming communities. The SAPS has been requested at all levels of policing to pay attention to the type of crime and assist complainants (farmers or security guards working for farmers) to report complaints, attend crime scenes, launch crime prevention actions and operations and ensure that arrests are made.

Farmers are advised to insist that all crimes are discussed during monthly meetings so that suggestions and solutions emerge regarding policing.

FSA has drawn up a guideline document on what farmers should put in place when they are targeted by maize thieves, especially regarding policing. Free State Agriculture operates a WhatsApp Chatbot where farmers can report all incidents – regardless of whether they have been reported to SAPS.

The system automatically categorizes messages and shares them with Free State Agriculture for follow-up.

# Monthly meetings – SAPS within national rural safety strategy

During a Priority Committee meeting with the SAPS, FSA expressed concern that monthly meetings within the National Rural Safety Strategy (NRSS) were not consistently taking place according to guidelines.

To address this, practical documentation was developed in Afrikaans and English to better structure meetings and improve results. This includes, among others:

- Power of attorney forms from farmers to safety representatives of farmers' associations to enable them to make inquiries about their criminal cases;
- Example of an agenda and what everything needs to be discussed, e.g. all crimes and feedback regarding operations/patrols/actions carried out by SAPS and other role players;
- List of cases on which feedback is requested from the Detectives (high profile cases);
- Complaint form that a farmer can hand over to a Station Commander if he/she is not satisfied with the investigation of a case (attendance at crime scene, etc.);
- A feedback report that is passed on to the regional safety representative of FSA;
- A checklist indicating what should be discussed at monthly meetings and feedback that should be obtained.

Safety representatives and sector leaders are encouraged to apply these guidelines where meetings are not functioning as desired and farmers are also encouraged to keep a clear paper trail if they are not satisfied with SAPS service delivery.

## RSA/Lesotho border

Free State Agriculture recently attended a cross-border meeting in Clocolan between SAPS and Lesotho's LMPS. Farmers were able to obtain direct contact details for Lesotho's stock theft unit to improve response times.

Key issues discussed included the FMD outbreak in Lesotho, stock theft, illegal grazing and other cross-border crimes. Lesotho declared a state of emergency in March 2026, with a 10 km livestock exclusion zone along the SA border.

The Setsoto Municipality is currently busy with vaccinations on communal lands in Ladybrand, Excelsior, Hobhouse and Tweespruit.

Meanwhile, the Department of Agriculture and Rural Development (DARDE) is setting up quarantine camps in four towns along the RSA/Lesotho border, namely QwaQwa, Ficksburg, Ladybrand and Wepener/Zastron.

Stock theft remains a serious concern in the Thabo Mofutsanyana district, with calls for more detectives and increased awareness campaigns in Lesotho communities to address related crimes, including cross-border grazing and the theft of products such as solar pumps and solar panels.
